The acquisition records lacked required information for dogs acquired from unlicensed persons. For acquisition dates 3/16/07, 3/25/07, 7/7/07, 7/11/07 and 7/21/07, driver's license and vehicle license numbers were not obtained from the seller and recorded on the records. Additionally, for acquisition dates 3/16/07, 3/20/07, 3/30/07, 8/10/07, 8/30/07, 10/18/07 and 10/25/07 (2 records for this date), the complete address, driver's license and vehicle license numbers were not obtained from the seller and recorded on the records. This does not allow for tracking of the animals or to ensure that they came from proper sources. Licensee must ensure that all required information is obtained from the seller when acquiring animals to ensure that facility records are complete, accurate and contain all required information. This affected 47 animals. CORRECT FROM THIS POINT ON.

The adult inventory on the licensee's computerized forms (approved by variance to replace APHIS Form 7005) do not contain the acquisition dates and information of whom the dog(s) were acquired from. This does not allow for tracking of the animals and thorough review of facility records by the inspector. Licensee must ensure that records are complete, accurate and contain all required information. CORRECT BY MAY 22, 2008.

MINIMUM AGE REQUIREMENTS.

No dog shall be delivered by any person to any carrier or intermediate handler for transportation, in commerce, or shall be transported in commerce by any person unless such dog is at least eight (8) weeks of age and has been weaned.

There were 33 puppies transported in commerce that were less than 8 weeks old. Twenty-nine puppies were acquired for resale and transported by the licensee underage. This included 3 puppies at 52 days of age (acquisition date 7/5/07), 3 puppies at 53 days of age (acq. date 8/10/07), 9 puppies at 54 days of age (acq. dates 6/26/07 and 9/6/07), and 14 puppies at 55 days of age (acq. dates 3/21/07, 4/6/07, 5/18/07, and 10/12/07). Additionally, four puppies were transported and sold by the licensee at 55 days of age (sale dates 8/28/07 and 11/13/07). Transporting underage puppies could affect their health and licensee must not transport any puppy until it is at least 8 weeks old (56 days) to ensure its well-being. This affected 33 animals.



No dealer shall knowingly obtain any dog from any person who is not licensed without obtaining a certification that the animals were born and raised on that person's premises and that the person does not maintain more than three breeding female dogs and/or cats.

There were 23 dogs that were knowingly acquired from unlicensed persons for which a certification statement was not obtained by the licensee. This does not ensure that dogs were acquired from exempt sources. Licensee must not obtain dogs from unlicensed sources without first obtaining a written certification statement from the seller to ensure that they are not required to be licensed and the dogs were born and raised on their property. This affected 23 dogs.

No dog shall be transported in commerce by any person unless such dog is at least eight (8) weeks of age and has been weaned. There were 53 puppies purchased from breeders for resale before they were 8 weeks of age. Additionally, 29 puppies were sold before they were 8 weeks of age. In total, 30 puppies were transported (puppies acquired and sold early) at 55 days of age, 16 at 54 days, 5 at 53 days, 14 at 52 days, 10 at 51 days, 5 at 50 days, and 2 at 49 days of age. Transporting puppies less than 8 weeks of age could affect their health and make them more susceptible to health problems. Licensee must not transport any puppy in commerce unless they are at least 8 weeks (56 days) old. This affects 82 animals.

From January 2006-present there were 28 puppies acquired from unlicensed sources for which certification statements were not acquired. This does not allow the inspector to determine if they came from proper sources that are either licensed or exempt from licensing. Licensee must ensure certification statements are completed for all acquisitions from unlicensed persons. This affects 28 animals. (Note: Licensee did complete certification statements for some acquisition of puppies from unlicensed persons. These are not included in the citation.)

The majority of the puppies were acquired from breeders before they were eight weeks of age and the rest were sold/transported by the facility underage. Forty-five puppies were sold at 55 days old, 17 puppies at 54 days old, 8 puppies at 53 days old, 13 puppies at 52 days old and 3 puppies at 51 days old. Transporting underage puppies could affect their health. Facility must ensure that all puppies are at least eight weeks old (56 days) before they are transported in commerce. 
